



ASAP FAQ's



Q: When did ASAP start at Waubonsie Valley?

A: ASAP is new to Waubonsie Valley this school year.

Q: Who are you looking for to be apart of ASAP?

A: Any student wanting any type of academic assistance or simply a quiet place to study.

Q: How much of a time commitment is ASAP?

A: ASAP not a commitment at all...it is strictly voluntary. However, we do ask that if you show, please do so at 2:45 and plan ot stay until 3:45...however, it's really up to you.

Q: Is ASAP a tutoring program?

A: Not exactly. While students may be heavily encouraged to attend ASAP by their teachers students can also choose to drop in to receive academic support or for a structured after school homework space.

Q: Is ASAP a place where students can complete re-takes?

A: No. Although we may expand to a retake center in the future, at this point ASAP is not a location for test taking or retakes.

Q: Do students have to come to ASAP?

A: No. ASAP is an optional program for students who could benefit from extra support in a subject area, or need a structured environment to complete their homework.

Q: What content areas are supported in ASAP ?

A: No. There will be 1 coordinator and 3 teachers to offer academic guidance (totaling four adults at each meeting). At current, we have Social Studies, Science and Spanish supported. We are desperately working on finding a Math ASAP teacher.
