



Dear Parent/Guardian:

This winter, Indian Prairie School District 204 administered the *i-Ready* assessments to students in kindergarten through eighth grade. These Illinois Learning Standards aligned assessments provide comprehensive insight into student learning across multiple domains for both reading and mathematics. *iReady* assessments are administered again in the spring. The purpose of these assessments is to evaluate student academic growth toward end of year expectations. These assessment results are used by teachers and administrators to assist with instructional planning and differentiation at the grade, classroom and student level.

Depending on grade level, reading measures assess phonological awareness, phonics, high-frequency words, vocabulary, comprehension of literature and comprehension of informational text; and mathematics measures assess number and operations, algebra/algebraic thinking, measurement/data, and geometry. These areas of performance are summarized in an overall reading and mathematics score.

Your child's national percentile ranks in these academic areas will be available within *ParentVUE* on Friday, March 11, 2022 at

Once in *ParentVUE*, choose the *Test History* tab  from the menu on the left-hand side. Please note that the average range extends from the 16th to 84th percentile rank; variations in your child's scores should be interpreted in the context of other indicators of academic performance including daily classroom work, teacher observation, historic academic performance, etc.



The iReady system summarizes each student's performance as a single composite score for reading and another for math. Rather than reporting these scores, which would have little meaning, the scores in ParentVUE are reported as a percentile. The percentile score indicates how a student's performance compares to other students nationally.

Each student will receive a national percentile for reading and for math.

Below is an example of how the scores will appear in ParentVUE.

A National Percentile of 46 indicates that this student scored as well or better than 46% of the students across the United States.

Percentiles do not indicate the percentage of questions that a student answered correctly. Rather, they describe how a student's final score compares to a group.

Percentile Example:



This student is in the 80th percentile for height. This means that the student is as tall as or taller than 80% of this group.
