Earlier we sent a letter to you from Charles Sprandel, Executive Director of Research and Assessment, explaining the upcoming required State PARCC and DLM Assessments. At Owen we will be administering the assessment to all students in grades 3-5 taking the PARCC starting Monday, March 5 through March 16th. Students taking the DLM will start March 14 and may take until May 9 to complete. We request that you avoid pulling your student out of school during those weeks.

We take these assessments seriously and ask that you help your student do their best by making sure they **get a good night's sleep** during the testing window and **eat a good breakfast** each morning. These two factors can help them focus and perform to the best of their ability. We also ask you to **send in a cheap pair of ear buds in a clearly labeled baggie** for the testing. Portions of the test will require students to use them. If you are unable to do so please let Mr. Martin, the classroom teacher, or me know.

Recess During Winter or Inclement Weather -Important Repeat-

During the winter months students need to bring or wear snow pants, boots, mittens/gloves, a hat, and a coat. We call them the Fab Five to help them remember what they need if they want to play in the field when there is snow.

Once the wood chips freeze on the playground area and we are not allowed to use the equipment until they thaw out. The District checks this in the Spring and will let us know when we can use it.

The blacktop area may also be used by all students, but students must have the appropriate outdoor winter clothing and boots. Tennis shoes are not appropriate for outdoor recess during the winter months. There is no traction or heat provided for the child.

When the outside temperature with wind chill reaches five (5) degrees or lower, the students are supervised in the gymnasium during recess. On occasion, we may stay indoors for recess regardless of the temperature if the blacktop area has not been cleared or has several patchy areas of ice.
