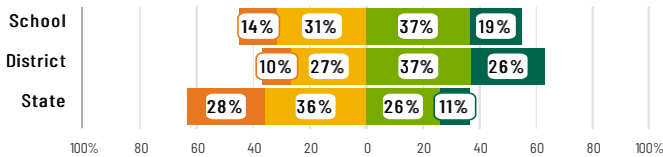

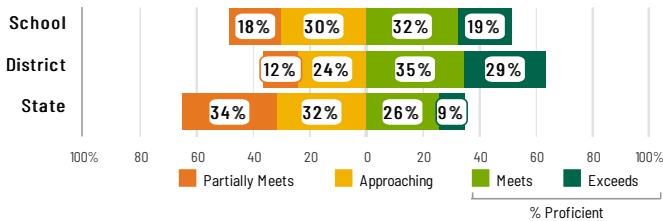

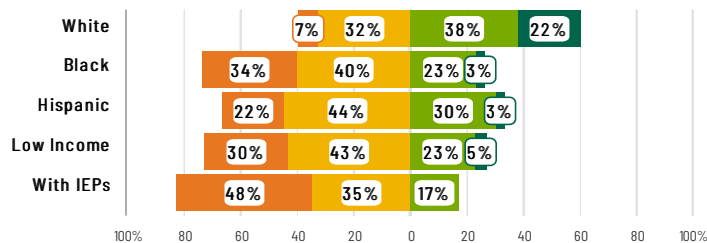

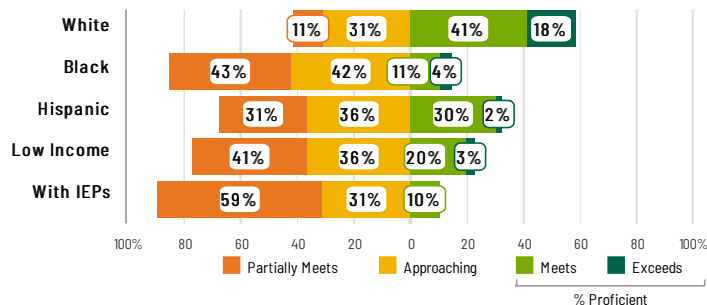
Success by Student Group

This display shows SAT ELA & Math performance levels for each student group. No data is shown for groups with fewer than 10 students.

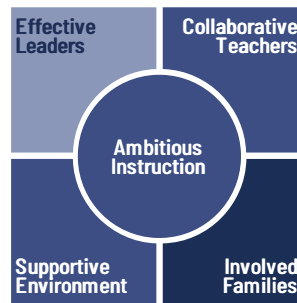

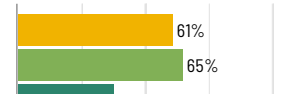

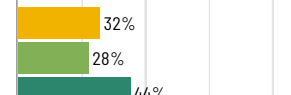
Postsecondary Enrollment

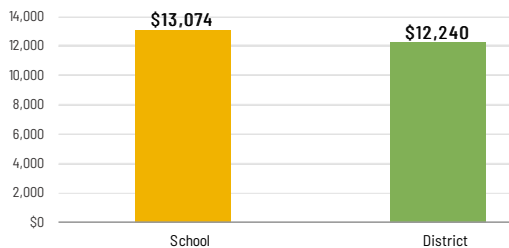

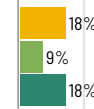
Attendance Rate

Rate at which students are present at school, not including excused or unexcused absences



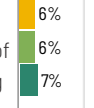
Chronic Absenteeism
