- [4-H Teen Science & Health Ambassadors](#) – Click for 2017 training events for 6th to 12th graders. Build skills in leadership, communication, teamwork, STEM concepts and more! The next training dates is Dec. 13 in Naperville.
- [Robotics 1 Workshop Series](#) – Led by an experienced 4-H robotics volunteer, youth will work in pairs to explore designing and building with Lego Mindstorms EV3 kits. Participating youth will learn loops, conditional statements & problem solving; about mechanical and software design; to program robots to capture objects, avoid obstacles, and follow commands; and to build teamwork and communication skills. This 3-session series is designed for youth in grades 3 to 8. Registration closes Dec. 3. Space is limited!
- [Bridge Bust Contest](#) – Registration extended to Nov. 15 for this fun challenge! Open to youth, family, and school teams. This fun, challenging annual competition tests bridge-building prowess, and encourages math, engineering and design skills! 4-H Youth Development is a multi-faceted program that includes 4-H community clubs, special interest (SPIN) clubs, in-school and after-school learning opportunities, and other youth outreach activities for ages 8 to 18. 4-H also offers a Cloverbud program for youth ages 5 to 7. These positive youth development programs provide the opportunity for youth to feel a sense of belonging, develop independence, practice generosity, and experience mastery.
