OPERATION SNOWFLURRY is a day-long substance abuse prevention program *for fourth and fifth grade* students. District #204 students can attend **either** February 20th at Crone Middle School or March 20th at Granger Middle School. The program delivers information about alcohol, tobacco, and other drugs, communication skills, decision-making and problem-solving skills in a fun and interactive format using professional speakers, small group discussion, and drug-free high school student leaders. Parents are encouraged to attend the parent session beginning at 3:00 pm for an overview of their child's day.

SNOWFLURRY is based on the belief that accurate, reliable information leads to positive responsible decision-making. The spirit of the SNOWFLURRY program provides that participants have an opportunity to meet students from other schools in a safe and respectful setting. The format of the day (large group presentations followed by small group discussions and activities) promotes the development of a support system within that peer groups. Groups are facilitated by an adult leader, and a drug free high school age teen leader.

4. Exposing him to peers he DOES NOT KNOW and helping him realize everyone is differently "abled."
5. Explaining to me the importance of telling my child that I "Expect him not to use!"

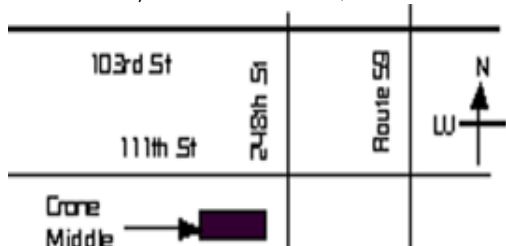

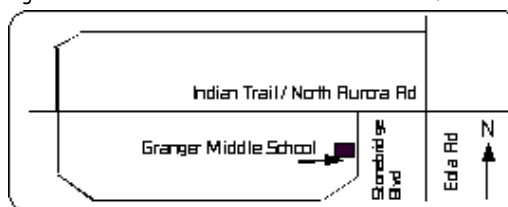

Directions: Granger is south of North Aurora Rd and west of Eola Rd in the Stonebridge subdivision. From Route 59, turn west onto North Aurora Rd (becomes Indian Trail). Drive .4 miles past Eola Rd. Turn south (left) onto Stonebridge Blvd. The school is located one block south of Indian Trail.
