Support the Prevent School Violence Act
Ask Governor Quinn to Sign SB3266 

Current law protecting Illinois students from bullying is a toolbox without tools, requiring schools to have an anti-bullying policy but failing to define bullying or provide any guidance on implementation. SB 3266, the Illinois Prevent School Violence Act, would modify current law to prevent and address school violence.

This bill would comprehensively define bullying for the first time in Illinois law; provide specific clarification to an existing mandate that will be helpful to schools and districts that need to draft the required anti-bullying policy to make their schools safe; and would establish the Illinois Bullying Prevention Task Force to identify best practices and support schools in implementing prevention programs. Most importantly, this bill would aid schools in addressing bullying without costing more dollars. Lives will be saved through suicide prevention and more students will stay in school.
